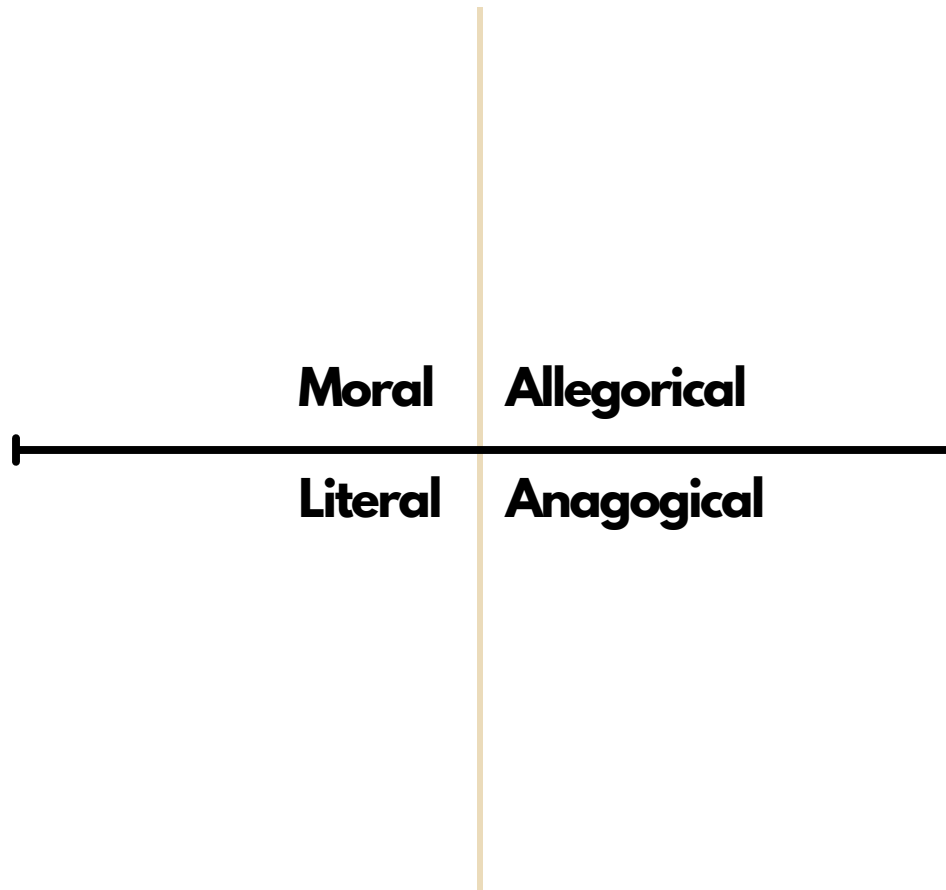

| Fills empty vessels with oil (2 Kings 4:1-7)                     | Water into wine Jn 2:1-10       |
| Raises son to life (2 Kings 4:31-37)                             | Raises son to life Luke 7:11-17 |
| Feeds 100 men with 20 loaves and has leftovers (2 Kings 4:42-44) | Feeds 4000 Mathew 14:13-21      |
| Curse Naaman of leprosy (2 Kings 5:1-14)                         | Cures lepers (Luke 17:11-19)    |
| Makes ax float on water (2 Kings 6:1-7)                          | Walks on water Matthew 14:22-33 |

| <b>Tobit</b>   | fable book about a man's journey with Raphael the Archangel           |

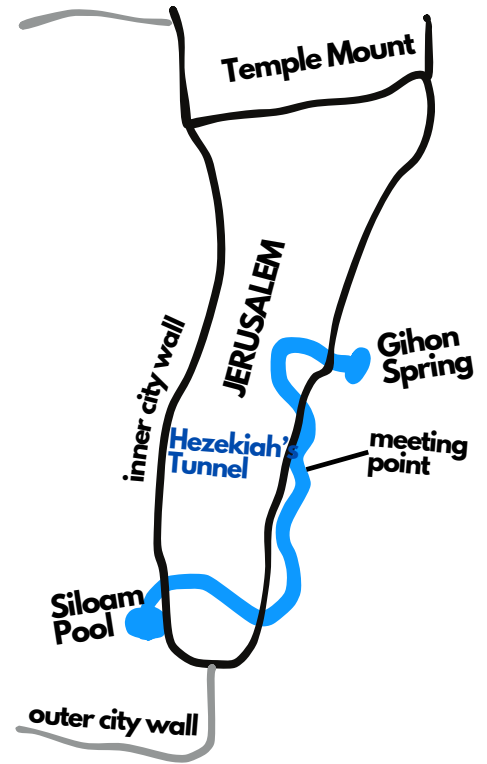


## Fall of South in 3 Stages

| Exile        | refers to when Israel & Judah's enemies took them over and scattered them                                           |
| Lamentations | book of laments written by Jeremiah                                                                                 |
| Baruch       | Jeremiah's scribe & author of 'Baruch'                                                                              |
| Hezekiah     | Good king of Judah who built a tunnel to stop the siege of his city, delaying the 3rd wave of exile for a few years |
